

HOLY TRINITY, PORT MELBOURNE.

The Anglican church at Port Melbourne was destroyed by a gale in September of last year, and efforts are being made towards its re-erection. The guardians have received tenders for a new church, which show that the cost for the nave will not be less than £1000. Towards this sum there is from every source not more than £800 available. Appeals have been sent to a large number of church people, and the authorities request that their replies should be forwarded as soon as possible. The Rev. H. B. Hallow, incumbent of the parish, and the parishioners are continuing their efforts towards augmenting the fund, but outside assistance is necessary. In the meantime services are being held in the schoolroom, which is altogether unsuitable for the purpose. The Archbishop has promised strong support to the movement.
