 and Testament Also I give and bequeath to the poor Widows  
 of and belonging to the Parish of St. Mark's aforesaid the  
 sum of One Shilling each to be paid to them by my said Executor  
 when he thinks proper and all which said Legacies I will shall  
 be paid to the above mentioned Legators within nine Months &  
 next after my decease provided nevertheless that in case my  
 personal Estate shall happen to be insufficient for the payment  
 of the first mentioned Legators being fifteen in Number (after  
 payment of my just debts funeral and probate charges) then and in  
 such case I will that all and every such Legators shall re-  
 ceive only a proportionable part thereof according to the amount  
 of his or her Legacy and all the rest and residue of my Goods Chattels  
 personal Estate and Effects whatsoever and wheresoever after a  
 payment of my just debts funeral and probate charges I give  
 and bequeath unto the said fifteen Legators equally and so  
 to be divided between them share and share alike In Witness  
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this thirteenth  
 day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
 and ten The mark of Elizabeth X Littleby Signed Sealed  
 published and declared by the said Testatrix Elizabeth Littleby  
 as and for her last will and Testament in the presence of us  
 who in her presence and at her request have subscribed our  
 names as Witnesses Hannah Moulton John Threlton

Proved at London the 16th June 1815 before the Judge by  
 the Oath of William Crowfoot Esq. my Sole Executor to whom  
 Adm'n was granted having been first sworn by Commission duly  
 to administer.

## This is the last Will

and Testament of me Hannah King of Chancery in  
 the County of Surrey Widow Whereas I have bequeathed unto one  
 fourth part of the clear Residue and remainder of the Estate  
 and Effects of Christopher Dravergill late of Mincing Lane in  
 the City of London Gentleman deceased consisting of the  
 principal sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds four per Cent  
 Consolidated Bank Annuities subject to the life Interest of my sister  
 in Law Elizabeth Stacey therein Deceased I do give and bequeath unto  
 my fourth part therein unto my Deceased and good friend James  
 Eales of Mithram in the County of Surrey aforesaid upon Trust to  
 divide the same in equal shares and proportions between my  
 two Children Charles King and Sarah Cad wife of George Cad  
 of Drurying Sword Alley Water Lane Fleet Street London in  
 manner hereinafter mentioned that is to say to pay and  
 divide one equal half part unto my said Son Charles King and in  
 case of his death to divide the same equally unto and amongst  
 all and every the Children or Child of my said Son as shall be living  
 at the time of my decease and as to the other moiety or half part  
 thereof It is my will and desire that my said Deceased shall stand  
 possessed thereof in Trust to pay the Interest dividends and produce  
 into the proper hands of my said Daughter Sarah Cad during her present  
 Coverture in order that the same shall not be subject to the debts or  
 contract or engagements of her present Husband and in case my  
 said Daughter shall survive her said said Husband then to pay  
 the principal thereof unto my said Daughter Sarah Cad and in

case of my said Daughters death without Issue then to pay or transfer her part or share thereof unto my said Son Charles and in case of his death to his issue equally share and share alike and in case of the death of both my said Son and Daughter without Issue living then to pay and transfer the same fourth part thereof unto my sister Mary Calves Sister of the said James Calves her Executors or Administrators In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this twentieth day of April One Thousand Seven Hundred and twenty The mark of  
*Hannah King* (S) Signed Sealed published and declared by the above named Testatrix as and for her last will and Testament in the presence of Tobias Stapleton Simons and Robt. Cartwright Donnam Street.

On the 10th June 1814 Admorsion with the will annexed of the Goods Chattels & Credits of Hannah King late of Clapham County of Surrey Widow deceased was granted to Robert King one of the Grand Children and next of kin and one of the parties entitled in distribution to the personal Estate and Effects of the said deceased having been first sworn duly to administer the Executor or Residuary Legatee being named therein.

**This is the last Will and Testament of me Mary Kimber of Croydon in the County of Surrey Widow** I give to Jane Shaw the wife of John Shaw of Croydon aforesaid the sum of twenty pounds, I give to James Constable of Croydon aforesaid Shilksman the sum of ten pounds and I give to his Children all my wearing Apparel to be delivered and distributed among them at such times and manner as to my Executors shall seem most expedient and subject to the payment of the above Legacies and of my just debts and funeral and Testamentary Expenses I give devise and bequeath all my Movable or Immovable and Real Estate in Croydon aforesaid and elsewhere and all the residue and remainder of my personal Estate unto peticure Ann Winstanley (dame of James Jones of Croydon) and to her Executors Admors and Assigns for ever I appoint John William Winstanley of Croydon aforesaid Gentleman and the above named James Jones Brother Executors of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this twelfth day of January One Thousand Eight Hundred and thirteen *Mary Kimber* (S) Signed Sealed published and declared by the Testatrix Mary Kimber as and for her last will and Testament in the presence of us who at her request in her presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names as Witnesses thereto *Willm Meager Tho.
