Service History

- Attests 11/12/1915 in Maidenhead | Approved 01/03/1916 in Reading | "Duration of War" | assume that enlisted under the Derby Scheme (i.e. a volunteer rather than conscripted) | Employed as a roadman
 - Still living at the Greyhound Pub
 - Occupation ("trade or calling") recorded as Roadmaker
 - 30 Years 4 months (d.o.b therefore about August 1885 – matches Q3 1885 mmn Webb Cookham, Berkshire 2C 405)

- Height 5ft 6 ¾ | Chest 36" range of expansion 2" | Weight 150lbs (10st 10lb) | Physical development Good | 2 thumbs and four fingers on right hand | slight hernia left side
 - "Fit for home service only", "Ineligible for infantry".
 - Next of kin: Father – Thomas Croxford (Greyhound Pub, Burchett Green)
- 11/12/1915 – 01/03/1916: Royal Berkshire Regiment (England – Army Reserve)
- 01/03/1916: Mobilised
- 02/03/1916 – 27/03/1916 In Reading at the Depot of the Berkshire Regiment doing basic training
- 27/03/1916 – 07/05/1916: Allocated to Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry, then attached to 3rd Battalion Somerset Light Infantry (a training unit in Taunton) as a Private.
 - 28/04/1916 appointed unpaid Lance Corporal
- 07/05/1916 – 09/05/1917: In France as part of British Expeditionary Force with 12th Battalion, Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry
 - 07/05/16 Embarked Southampton | 08/05/16 Disembarked Havre
 - 07/05/1916 appointed paid Lance Corporal ("in the field")
 - 08/08/1916 appointed paid acting Corporal ("in the field")
 - 14/08/1916 promoted to Corporal ("in the field")
- 09/05/1917: Still in France, transferred to Labour Corps 156 Company (12th Battalion DCLI became 156 and 157 Companies of the Labour Corps and so ceased to exist from May 1917. The Labour Corps itself had been formed in January 1917.).
 - 14/05/1917 promoted to Sergeant
- 16/09/1918 – 30/09/18 Leave to go to UK via Boulogne (14 days)
- 12/1918: 156th Company Labour Corps moved from 4th Army to 3rd Army (WO 95/384/13)
- 28/12/1918: Awarded Meritorious Service Medal for "valuable services" (Page 68, Supplement to the London Gazette, 01/01/1918 – 93118 Sjt F T Croxford, Labour Corps (Maidenhead, Berks))
 - On file is a letter from Francis informing that he had not yet received the medal.
- 15/03/1919: Still in France, posted to 175 Company Labour Corps
- 01/04/1919 – 15/04/1919 Leave to UK via Calais
- 12/08/1919 – 26/08/19 Leave to ???
- 07/09/1919 Beginning of discharge process (had medical in Mauberge, France? And listed at [medical category B2](#) – B: Free from serious organic diseases, able to stand service on lines of communication in France, or in garrisons in the tropics. 2: Able to walk 5 miles, see and hear sufficiently for ordinary purposes)
- 12/09/1919: Dispersal Unit Crystal Palace | Place of re-joining in case of emergency Park Royal
- 30/09/1919: Awarded British War Medal
- 12/09/1921: Awarded Victory Medal
