
A FORTNIGHT UNCONSCIOUS.

INJURED ON DUTY.

After lying unconscious in the Auckland Hospital for almost two weeks Mr. William Campbell, the injured tramway motorman, died at 4.45 p.m. yesterday. Deceased was knocked down by a motor car on the Great South Road a fortnight ago to-day, while he was checking his time on the roadside clock.

The late Mr. Campbell served in the Tramway Department for 17 years, during which time he earned the greatest respect of the management and his fellow-employees. He was 51 years of age.

The funeral will take place at Otahuhu to-morrow afternoon, when the Tramways Union and the Tramways Club, of which deceased was a member, will be represented by officials and a large number of members.

Adding to the sadness of the case is the fact that Mrs. Campbell was away during the time her husband was in hospital, and she arrives in Wellington from England to-day, just one day after his death.
